






Our Golden Rules

- I will be polite to everyone and listen when they are talking.
- I will be kind and respectful to everyone.
- I will keep our Academy tidy and take care of our equipment.
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- I will walk safely and quietly around the Academy.
- I will always try to be the best I can in 'mind, body and spirit'.
- I will bring everything that I need for the day.
- I will tell an adult in the Academy if I am worried about anything.



At the start of every day, all children will start on green. If you stay on green, you will be able to earn two smilies.

If you have had a warning and continue to not follow the school's rules, you will move on to amber, and then red. If you turn your behaviour around, your teacher may move you back up, but you will not get two smilies.

How can I stay on GREEN?

- Always following instructions
- Always completing classroom work to a high standard
- Always bringing complete PE kit
- Always wearing appropriate uniform
- Always reading the previous night at home
- Always bringing reading book or bag
- Always bringing signed diary
- Always arriving at school on time

Why would I move to AMBER?

- Not following instructions
- Not completing classroom work during the session
- Not completing classroom work to a high standard
- Not bringing complete PE kit
- Not wearing appropriate uniform
- Not reading the previous night at home
- Not bringing reading book or bag
- Not bringing in signed diary
- Not arriving at school on time

Why would I be on RED?

- Physical incidents
- Spitting
- Verbal incidents, for example: swearing, shouting at adults/children
- Refusal to work or follow instructions after warnings or after being moved to amber
- Vandalising school equipment
- Bullying
- Theft
- Deliberately coughing on someone

What is **RESPECT?**

- At the end of the week a child in the class will be given a Respect Star certificate by the class teacher for displaying RESPECT in our Academy.
- You can also reach the RESPECT STAR if you receive a Respect certificate from Mrs Simpson or Mr Alcock.
- If you haver reached the RESPECT STAR and have been to every termly Balloon Party, which we will talk about next, you will be able to go to the RESPECT PARTY. This will be a full day of exciting activities at the end of the year.



BALLOON PARTIES



- If you achieve the target number of smilles for each term, your name will be put onto the Balloon Party and you will go to that party. We will decide, as a class, what we do for each party.
- If you attend the bronze, silver and gold party, and reach the Respect Star during the year, you will be able to attend the RESPECT party! This will be a big exciting party for those children who have been on their best behaviour.
- If your behaviour changes in a negative way after you have been put onto the Balloon Party, you will have 10 marks taken away from you on the class chart and you will be taken off the Balloon Party. Your parents/carers will also be informed.

Certificates

If you show **RESPECT** in our Academy, you could earn this certificate from Mrs Simpson, Mr Alcock or our class teacher.



How can I earn smilies?



- You get 2 if you stay on green all day.
 You can get an additional smilie if a member of staff sees you being a good role model around the Academy.
- If you move to amber or red, but move back to green before the end of the day, you can earn 1 smilie.
- If you read 5 times a week, you get a smilie.
- If you complete holiday homework, you can earn smilies.

How can I earn extra smilies?



- You get I smilie extra (plus your 2 for green) if you move on to the Respect Star
 You get one smilie if you receive the Respect Star or the weekly certificate!
- •You can earn I additional smilie ONLY, every day for doing something super. This could be your behaviour, or a piece of work, etc.

•You can also earn smilies for when you complete homework during the holidays. We will explain this when the time comes.

Holiday Homework and Projects

- No Christmas Homework
- Easter Maths and English
- Half Term Projects based on our topic will earn you up to 3 smilies, dependent on the standard.
- Summer Term Project
