## For the attention of parents with children in Miss Davies' class

Dear Parents/Carers,

## Advice to Self-Isolate for 10 Days

Unfortunately, as per guidance from Cheshire East, we do feel that your child needs to self-isolate for 10 days from Friday 12<sup>th</sup> March until the end of the day on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> March. This is because your child may have come into direct, close contact with a child who has subsequently tested positive for Covid. The child did not have any Covid-related symptoms on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> March. However, they tested positive and received results on Monday.

We are asking you to do this to reduce the further spread of Covid-19 to others in the community.

Please be assured that all the government guidelines have been followed. As stated in the <u>guidance for</u> <u>full reopening of schools</u>. The government recognise that it is very difficult to socially distance with younger children.

If your child is well at the end of the 10 days period of self-isolation, they no longer have to selfisolate. **A negative test does not mean that you can stop self-isolation earlier than 10 days**. Other members of your household, including siblings, can continue to attend school provided they do not develop symptoms of Covid-19 within the 10 day self-isolation period.
